<p>State whether "Head," or "Wife," or "Son," or "Daughter," or other Relative, "Visitor," "Boarder," or "Servant."</p> <p>For infants under one year state the age in months as "under six months," "one month," etc.</p> <p>Write "Single," "Married," "Widower," or "Widow," opposite the name of all persons aged 15 years and upwards.</p> <p>Completed from the present Marriage list listed, if less than one year since issue or death.</p> <p>State for each Married Woman entered on this Schedule, the number of—</p> <p>Children born alive to present Marriage. (If no children born alive write "None" in Column 7.)</p> <p>Children born dead.</p> <p>Children who have died.</p> <p>The reply should show the precise branch of Profession, Trade, Manufacture, &c.</p> <p>If engaged in any Trade or Manufacture, the particular kind of work done, and the Article made or Material worked or dealt in should be clearly indicated.</p> <p>(See Instructions 1 to 8 and Examples on back of Schedule.)</p> <p>This question should generally be answered by stating the business carried on by the employer. If this is clearly shown in Col. 12, the question need not be answered here.</p> <p>No entry needed for Domestic servants in private employment. If employed by a public body (Government, Municipal, etc.) state what body.</p> <p>(See Instructions 9 and Examples on back of Schedule.)</p> <p>Write opposite the name of each person engaged in any Trade or Industry: (1) "Employee" when a receiving person other than domestic servant, or (2) "Worker" when working for an employer, or (3) "Own Account" when a genuine employer other than a trade employer.</p> <p>Write the words "At Home" opposite the name of each person serving as Trade or Industry at Home.</p> <p>(1) If born in the United Kingdom, write the name of the County, and Town or Parish.</p> <p>(2) If born in any other part of the British Empire, write the name of the Dependency, Colony, &c., and of the Province or State.</p> <p>(3) If born in a Foreign Country, write the name of the Country.</p> <p>(4) If born at sea, write "At Sea."</p> <p>NOTE.—In the case of persons born elsewhere than in England or Wales, state whether "Scottish" or "Victor" in this Country.</p> <p>State whether— (1) "British subject by parentage," (2) "Naturalized British subject," giving year of naturalization, (3) "Totally Blind," (4) "Lame," (5) "Deaf," (6) "Paralysed," or "Fallsick," state the infirmity opposite that person's name, and the age at which he or she became afflicted.</p>
